Who We Are

Excelsior is a family-oriented resource used in tandem with homeschooling. We offer classes from four-year old to high school seniors. It is a resource center, *not a school*. The primary teaching responsibility of each student remains with the parent. However, we do not offer only strong academic instruction; we also have times for your student to build relationships inside and outside of the classroom. Excelsior is not a third option support group and satisfies no requirements for legal accountability. You must register with either your school district, SCAIHS, or a third option support group by the 10th day of your district's start date to legally homeschool.

What We Offer

The Academy classes, ages 4-13, will develop an effective Christian worldview as we study literature, history, and the fine arts based on various time periods. All our High School offerings are college-preparatory classes with honors options, which must be declared at the beginning of the school year. With honors, they will have papers, projects, and presentations (as decided by their teacher) graded on a more strenuous scale in addition to their regular class-load. Students who declare honors will pay an extra \$50 fee directly to the teacher due to extra planning and grading on their part. High school students can take part in monthly socials, occasional service projects, and an annual spring formal.

Mission Statement

Our goal as Christian parents is to raise children who love Christ and know how to apply the principles of their faith to the world around them. We must intentionally and faithfully pass on to our children the mission of reclaiming and redeeming the culture for the glory of God. This dominion mandate was first given in Genesis and is reconfirmed by Paul as he tells us we must learn "to bring every thought captive to Christ." We believe, and must affirm daily to our children, that all things (from the physical to the academic) hold together in Christ.

Statement of Faith

We believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth; and in Jesus Christ His only Son our Lord; Who was conceived by the Holy Ghost; born of the Virgin Mary; suffered under Pontius Pilate; was crucified, dead, and buried; He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven and sits on the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from thence He shall come to judge the quick and the dead. We believe in the Holy Ghost; the holy apostolic church, the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body; and the life everlasting.

Orientation

A **mandatory** Orientation will be held on **Thursday, August 18, 2022**, at New Heights Church. The purpose of this meeting is to introduce the teachers, review policies, and verify that registration/tuition fees have been paid. At this time, parents and students will be able to pick up their schedule for the upcoming school year. We look forward to meeting you and your student and forming a relationship with everyone as the school year progresses.

Student Code of Conduct

Our goal is to pursue excellence in all that we do so that our Lord may be glorified.

In order to maintain a productive, educational environment the instructors and staff will require proper and respectful behavior from all students.

1. Students should treat instructors and staff with respect by the way they respond and react to those in authority. Students should not talk or interrupt the teacher while they are talking.
2. Students should treat other students with respect- keep hands and feet to themselves, not talk while someone else is talking, and speak kindly to and of others. Bullying will NOT be tolerated.
3. Students should treat the property of New Heights with respect by only staying in assigned areas and not crossing boundaries set by those in authority. No rough play will be permitted as it poses a safety hazard. *Students/parents must replace anything they waste, damage, or break.*
4. Only water bottles are allowed in the classrooms.
5. Students must clean up after themselves after each class. Trash, food, etc. should be thrown away after lunch without being asked.
6. Students may not bring any electronic devices or toys to school unless asked for by their instructor.
7. For high school students who have cell phones, they must be put up and away during class time. If they are seen with them out, the phone will be taken up and their parents will be notified. If parents or students need to contact the other, we would ask that they use the Excelsior phone, which is: (803) 743-3118.
8. Students are not allowed to have visitors. If you are not enrolled at Excelsior, you are not permitted on campus.

High School Attendance Policy

Excelsior desires to prepare our students for college and future endeavors through academic achievement and personal growth. As a result, we expect students to attend all classes. No more than one unexcused absence will be allowed without a parent's note. Also, students are expected to turn in all assignments on time. All assignments turned in late will receive a deduction in points for each day the assignment is late. Grace for special circumstances will be granted at the teacher's discretion, only after discussing with the parent. Books for classes are expected to be purchased ahead of time, so their progress is not impeded.

Sick Policy

Please do not bring your child to school sick. If your child is complaining of not feeling well or is exhibiting symptoms such as a sore throat or stomach, and/or is vomiting, having diarrhea, or is running a temperature of 100.0 degrees or above without medication, they are not allowed to attend school that week. If your child has had any of these symptoms within the last 48 hours, please do not bring them to school. You know your child better than anyone, so please be proactive in watching for signs and symptoms of sickness. If we see a child who does not look like they are feeling well, we reserve the right to call a parent to come pick them up. Although we hope that everyone stays as well as possible, we still will abide by our motto: "If in doubt, keep them out!"

Disciplinary Action

First offense-the student will be reminded by their teacher on how to behave. If asked multiple times throughout the class period, the student will speak with the directors and the parent will be notified via email.

Second offense- a phone call will be made to the parents about the unacceptable behavior.

Third offense- a meeting will be made with the parent, teacher, and directors where further action will be discussed such as expulsion from the class in question. If this is to occur, parents will still be required to pay for the class according to their financial commitment made previously at the beginning of the year.

Excelsior Dress Code

Our desire is to bring glory to God in everything we say, think, and do- including our appearance! We have set a dress code with a goal that our appearance will not be a distraction to others during our class time at Excelsior.

1. Skirts, dresses, and shorts may be worn if the length is past the tips of the fingers.
2. Clothing that does not fit properly is prohibited (too tight or too loose.) Pants may not be too large that they drag on the floor. They must be pulled up properly so that no underwear is visible.
3. No tank tops, shirts with spaghetti straps, or halter tops allowed. ABSOLUTELY no shirts will be allowed that show cleavage and/or midriff.
4. No clothing that represents offensive lifestyle or messages is allowed.
5. No hats are to be worn during class.

6. No pocket-knives, weapons, etc. are allowed on the campus of Excelsior.

Excelsior will notify parents of any student who is inappropriately dressed and will require parents to pick up their student.

Tuition Payment

All registration fees are required to be paid when you submit your application. You will receive your tuition bill by July 1st. All tuition must be paid in full by Orientation on **August 18, 2022** by check, credit card (fees applied), or via a tuition installment plan. Our tuition installment plan divides your tuition bill into 10 (ten) equal installments. To participate in the tuition installment plan we will need the first payment via check at Orientation on **August 18, 2022** along with a signed ACH Debit Authorization form provided by us. Installment payments will be debited from your account on the 1st business day of each month beginning in September and will end after your last installment in May. There is a \$1.00 installment fee added to your payment each month.

Financial Policy

We seek to be good stewards of that which has been entrusted to us. Therefore, for us to plan accurately, we ask each family to view their involvement as a commitment for the entire year. No refunds will be given, and all tuition must be paid in full except for the following reasons:

1. Death of a parent
2. Loss of a job
3. Moving out of state

No transfers of tuition to other families are allowed.

Excelsior Education Expectations

All students must come prepared for class, which includes:

1. Books, pencils, and other supplies needed for class
2. Homework assignments given by the teacher are meant to give the student a full week's worth of study material for that subject. The parents should review the assigned work and assist the student if needed. Parents should also help set a daily study schedule so that the work will be completed for the following class.
3. All students should complete and turn in all assignments on time. If a student misses class due to sickness or traveling, the student is responsible for contacting their teacher to receive copies of course notes or any hand-outs that were given.
4. Parents have the primary responsibility for the education of their student. Parents must take an active role in making sure that their student's work is completed, and the subject matter is understood and mastered.

Grading Scale and Report Cards

Academy classes, ages 4 to 8, will be given two semester evaluation forms. These will range from unsatisfactory to excellent and will have notes from their teacher included.

Academy classes, ages 9 to 13, will be given two semester grade reports along with any comments from their teacher.

High school students will be given two semester report cards. The grading scale being enforced is the same used by SCAIHS (<https://www.scaihs.org/>)

Students must have a final grade of a C or higher before being allowed to enroll in a higher course.

Weather Delays & Cancellations

When weather conditions are suspect, parents need to check emails frequently for notifications.
